


Message from the Director of Community Enterprise and the Arts

Introduction

Space for Art is Sligo County Council's investment in the imagination and creativity of Sligo's people and its artists. As in the poem *My Room* by Patrick Kavanagh, the arts have the capacity to transform space, place, individual and collective experience. In *My Room* he describes a musty ten by twelve attic room with a low roof and bed in the centre that performs many functions from table to writing desk to a slumber palace...

"But its little window

Lets in the stars."

Space for Art is about nurturing the imagination...

The plan sets out an overall strategy for the development of the arts in the city and county, in accordance with the Arts Act 2003. Research and development for the plan commenced in the spring of 2006, followed by the formal consultation process which concluded in March 2007. Since then a diverse team of researchers, colleagues, members of the public and talented individuals have helped realise this project. On behalf of Cathaoirleach and members of Sligo County Council, I wish to thank the staff of the Arts Department, senior consultant to the arts plan, Martin Drury, participating artists and council officials for their cooperation, enthusiasm and generosity.

An important theme in the plan is the further integration of the arts and artists in local planning and development processes to maximise opportunities for the arts, arising from Sligo's designation as a 'Gateway' (*National Spatial Strategy*, 2002). Sligo's status as the premier economic gateway of the northwest region is leading to unprecedented levels of investment in the city and county. Implementation of the arts plan will thus coincide with a period of significant physical, social and environmental change. Equally important in this political and economic climate will be the development of a strong urban identity and culturally engaging programmes that are accessible to Sligo's growing and diverse population.

The specific potential of the arts to contribute to this changing environment and the wider development of Sligo is immense. Access to the arts, education, culture and design will be key elements in the development of an environment that promotes diversity, creativity, tolerance and the exchange of ideas. However, success requires that the arts are brought into the mainstream of policy making through more '*joined up thinking*' forging links between cultural, social, economic, education, tourism and environmental policies.

Infhéstíú Chomhairle Chontae Shligigh i samhláiocht agus i gcruthaitheacht pobail agus ealaontóiri Shligigh is ea *Spás don Ealaion*. Mar atá sa dán, *My Room*, le Patrick Kavanagh, tá féidir leacht sna healaiona chun idir spás, suíomh, agus an t-eispíreas aonair nó comhchoiteann a chlaochlú ó bhonn. Sa dán, *My Room*, cuireann an file sios ar sheomra múisiúnta deich droim ar do dhéag thusa sa lochta, le sileáil íseal agus leabha ilúiséidé ina lár, ó bhorad go deas scribhneoireachta go codladhphálás...

Is dirthe ar chothú na samhlaiochta sin atá an plean Spás don Ealaion.

Leagan ann plean amach stráitéis fhorchuimsitheach d'fhonn forbraiocht na n-ealaiona sa chathair agus sa chontae a chur chun cinn de réir Acht na nEalaiona 2003. Tagadh faoi thraighe agus forbairt an phlean in Earrach 2006: tháinig delreadh leis an bpróiseas fairmeála comhairleach a lean é Mi Márta 2007. Ó shin chabhraigh raon ilgeainteach daointe, idir taighdeoirí, comhleacailthe, baill de phobal agus indibhidi tréitheacha, chun an pleán seo a chur i gcrích. Thar ceann Cathaoirligh agus bhaill Chomhairle Chontae Shligigh, ba mhaith liom buiochás a ghabhail le foireann na Roimhe Ealaiona, le priomh-chomhairleoir an phlean ealaiona, Martin Drury, leis na healaontóiri ranpháirteacha agus le hollfigh chomhairle as ucht a gcomhoibrithe, a ndiograis agus a mórchroí.

Téama tabhachtach sa phlean is ea na healaiona agus ealaontóiri a chumisiú i bpróisis phleanála agus forbairt d'fhearra agus deiseanna a eascrann an ainmniúchán Shligigh mar 'Bhealach Isteach' sa Straitéis Spásúil Náisiúnta (2002) a thapú. Tugann stádas Shligigh mar phriomh-bhealach agus foinse eacnamaíochta an réigiún larthuaidh deis ar infhéstíú gan eisearmláir sa chathair agus sa chontae. Tagann feidhmíú an phlean in aon am le tréimhse mórrathruille fisiciúil, sóisialta agus comhshaoil. Is den tabhacht é go bhforbróidh Sligeach féiniúlacht uirbeach láidir san aeráid reatha polaitíüil, eacnamaioch agus sóisialta seo chomh maith le cláracha talteamhacha cultúraí a bheidh ar fáil do dhaonra forásach ilchineálaíoch.

Tá pótíseal ollmhór ag na healaiona cur leis hathruithe sa timpeallacht agus le leathan-fhorbraiocht Shligigh. Beidh ionrochtain ar na healaiona, ar oideachas, ar chultúr agus ar dhea-dhearradh ina bpriomhfeilimintí i bhforbraiocht timpeallachta a chuireann ilchineálaíocht, cruthaitheacht, caonfhulaingt agus malartú smaointe chun cinn. Braitheann an toradh áfach ar na healaiona a bheith ina gcuid lárnach den forbairt beartas, trí 'smaoineamh nascailthe' nó an phleanáil chomhtháite, agus trí nascanna a chothú idir na polasaithe uile, cultúraí, sóisialta, eacnamaioch, oideachais, turasóireachta agus chomhshaoil.

Sligo Arts Service continues to place the people of Sligo at the heart of their plans



A hallmark of Sligo Arts Service is its commitment to identifying critical gaps in arts provision and to designing actions or services to address those gaps. The new plan continues this developmental commitment with innovative approaches to tackle issues raised in the consultation process ranging from audience development to building supportive networks.

New initiatives to address these issues include the establishment of five Arts Development Partnerships with Blue Raincoat Theatre Company, Ceolaras Coleman, Sligo Art Gallery, the Model Arts::Niland Gallery and the Hawk's Well Theatre. These strategic partnerships will result in the expansion of arts services in the county and to development of new opportunities for high quality artistic experiences and programmes for the public of Sligo.

As a public service arts provider Sligo Arts Service continues to place the needs of the people of Sligo at the heart of the plan. Since its inception, in order to meaningfully engage with issues of cultural exclusion and marginalisation, Sligo Arts Service has led long-term strategic processes targeting in particular the key areas of *arts and health* and *music education*.

It is therefore highly significant that in the implementation of this arts plan this body of work will be mainstreamed, and delivered through structured supports for the arts within the health and education systems, overseen by formal cross-sector partnerships.

The 2007–2012 Sligo Arts Plan is *strategic* in nature. It is not simply a menu of intended programmes, services and actions. Instead it is a consultation-informed, policy-driven strategy that identifies key actions to be taken by Sligo Arts Service, acting solely or with others. The actions identified take account of needs and priorities, and of capacity in terms of financial and other resources.

Is sainmharc de chuid Seirbhise Ealaiona Shligigh bearndáil critíciúla i soláthar na n-ealaiona a shainthint agus seirbhisi nó gniomhartha a rachadh i ngleic leis na bearndáil úd a cheapadh. Sa phlean nua, leantar leis an meon forbartha seo trí mhodhanna nádála chun tabhaint faoi cheisteanna a ardaiodh le linn an phróis chomhairleach, ó fhobairiachta lucht feachana go cothú lionra tacaiochta. Ar na modhanna nua chun dui i ngleic leis na ceisteanna seo tá bunú cùig Pháirtneireachtai i bhForbraiocht na nEalaiona: le Comhlach Amharclannaochta Blue Raincoat, le Ceolaras Coleman, le Áilleir Shligigh, le Áilleir Model Arts::Niland agus le Amharclann Hawk's Well. Deimhneoidh na compháirtiociochtai straitéisearcha seo forleathnú maidir le seirbhisi ealaiona an chontú agus forbroidh siad deiseanna nua i dtaca le eispéireas agus cláracha ealaiona den scóth do phobal Shligigh.

Mar sholáthaird é ealaionna sa réimse poiblí, déanann Seirbhís Ealaiona Shligigh riachtanais phobal Shligigh a chur i gcroílár an phleán. Is é uailmhan Sheirbhís Ealaiona Shligigh aghaidh a thabhaírt le héifeacht ar cheisteanna ar nós teorannú agus eisiamh cultúrtha. Ó bunaiodh i, dá réir, chuir sí roimpi prósí slaitéisearcha fhadtéarmacha a thúsú sna réimsí lárnacha, na healaiona agus an tSláinte agus ceolайдeachas. Tá sé ri-thábhachtach dá bhri sin, le feidhmíú an phleán ealaiona, go ndéanfar lársruthú ar an obair seo trí thacaiochtai struchtúrtha do na healaiona sna córais sláinte agus oideachais a fheidhmíú. Déanfar maoirseoiriacht ar an obair le compháirtiociochtai foirméalta tras-rannog.

Is Plean straitéisearach é Plean Ealaíona Shligigh 2007–2012. Mar sin ní clár nō liosta amháin é de chláraча le bheith, nō de sheirbhisi agus de gniomhartha. Is straitéis bunaithe ar chomhairliúchán agus ar bheartas é a thugann sainitheantas do na gniomhartha ag gá do Sheirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh iad a chur i gcrích, ina n-aonar nō i gcompháirtiocht le dreamanna éile. Tugann na gniomhartha sainitheantas seo aird ar riachtanais is ar thosaiochtai chomh maith le acmhainní, idir airgeadas agus éile.

Employing a range of support mechanisms and working with a variety of partners, Sligo Arts Service will ensure that Sligo's long-standing reputation as a 'cultural county' is secured and built upon.

Raiteas Misin

Leanfaidh Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh le forbairt na n-ealaíona i Shligeach, idir chathair agus chontae, thar ceann Údarás Áitiúla Shligigh ar bhealach a gcuirfidh sainiúlacht na n-ealaíona go mór le saol na ndaoine. Soláthraíodh Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh eispleireas den scóth thar na healaíona uile chun leasa cách i Sligeach, saoránaigh, cuairteoirí agus ealaíontóirí.

Cinteoideadh Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh neartú agus daingeanú ar chlú buan Shligigh mar 'chontae cultúrtha', trí mheán raon de shásrai tacailchta agus comhoibriú le páirtneáiri ilchineáil.



Central to the ethos of the plan are the themes; *Developing, Supporting, Prioritising and Providing*, for the Arts in Sligo. These themes inform the strategy and proposals of each of the eight Strands.



Context

This new arts plan arises in the context of significant achievement in the arts in Sligo by a wide range of individuals and organisations over an extended period. Whether measured in the millennia of archaeology, the centuries of history, or the decades of the recent past, Sligo has exceptional reason to be proud of its cultural identity. Tradition, of course, is a living thing, and in the creation of modern Ireland countless individuals, amateur organisations and professional artists, in or from Sligo, have achieved excellence and distinction.

More recently, the establishment of an Arts Office (now Sligo Arts Service) in 1997 within the framework of Sligo County Council and Sligo Borough Council has lent impetus to the strategic development of the arts within the county.

The initial Arts Office Programme **Placing Art (1997–2001)** and the subsequent first Sligo Arts Plan: **The Brightening Air (2002–2005)** identified

agendas for action that influenced the development of the current arts plan. Such recent arts planning in the local context sits within the wider national arts policy and planning framework represented most recently by the Arts Council's **Partnership For The Arts (2006–2008)** and the **Arts Act 2003**.

Another context which informed the new Sligo arts plan is one that is both present and future-oriented: the designation of Sligo as a 'Gateway' in the **National Spatial Strategy (2002–2020)** and indeed the wider context of the **National Development Plan (2007–2013)**. These broad national frameworks, in conjunction with the **Sligo County Development Board Action Plan for Economic, Social and Cultural Development (2006–2008)** and the **Corporate Plan for Sligo Local Authorities (2004–2009)**, combine to offer a positive context for the development of the arts within a wider social, economic and cultural frame of reference.

Comhthéacs an Phlean

Tagann an pleán nua ealaíona seo i gcomhthéacs éachtanna tábhachtacha agus dul chun cinn sna healaíona i Sligeach de thoradh saothair thar thréimhse fada ó raon leathan daóine aonair agus eagraíochtaí. Tá cuiseanna sonracha ann go mbeadh muintir Shligigh bródúil as a bhféiniúlach chultúrtha, biodh sin áirithe sna milte bláin den seandálaiocht, sna céadta bláin den stair nó sna bláinta deireanacha seo. Is rud beo é gan amhras an traidisún, agus is goruthú na hÉireann mar thír nua-aimseartha is mó duine aonair, eagras amaitéarach agus ealaíontóir proifisiúnta, bidis ó Shligeach nó ag saothrú ann, a bhain gradam agus barr feabhsa amach.

Le bláinta beaga anuas, thug bunú na hOfife Ealaíona (ar a dtugtar Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh anois) i 1997, laistigh de Chomhairle Contae Shligigh agus de Chomhairle Buirge Shligigh, spreagadh d'fhobraiocht straitéiseach na n-ealaíona sa chontae.

Dhéan an chéad chlár ón Oifig Ealaíona, **An Ealaíon agus Timpeallacht (1997–2001)** agus an pleán a lean, an Chéad Phlean Ealaíona do Shligeach: **An tAer a Lasann (2002–2005)**, cláracha oibre a shainiúil a chuaigh i bhfeidhm ar fhobraiocht an phlean éalaíona reatha. An fhobraiocht ealaíon is déanai seo sa chomhthéacs áitiúil, is cuid déan pholasai ealaíona agus den chreatlach pleáinála náisiúnta, mar a léirtear sa chlár **Comhpháirtíochtai do na hEalaíona (2006–2008)** ón gComhairle Ealaíon agus in **Acht na nEalaíon 2003**.

Tá dlúthbhaint ag an am faoi láthair agus ag an todhcháil leis an gcomhthéacs eile a chuaigh i gcionn an phlean nua ealaíona Shligigh. Is é sin ainmniúchán Shligigh mar 'Bhealach Isteach' sa **Straitéis Spásúil Náisiúnta (2002–2020)**. Cuirteann an Plean Forbraiochta Náisiúnta (2007–2013) an pleán áitiúil i gcomhthéacs nios leithne fós. Deimhnionn na creatlach náisiúnta leathana seo, maraon le **Plean Gnímh Eacnamaíoch, Sóisialta agus Cultúrtha Bhord Forbraiochta Chontae Shligigh (2006–2008)** agus **Plean Corporáideach Chomhairli Áitiúla Shligigh (2004–2009)**, comhthéacs dearfach d'fhobraiocht na n-ealaíona áitiúla. Beidh an pleán a fhobairt mar chuid de fhráma tagartha eacnamaíoch, sóisialta agus cultúrtha atá faisringed fadradharcach.

Delivering the Plan

The arts plan provides a five year framework for strategic action to be implemented by Sligo Arts Service on behalf of Sligo County Council in partnership with Sligo Borough Council, locally and the Arts Council, nationally. Each of the eight action strands will be supported by annual *Operational Plans* which will set out objectives and detail targets for work to be carried out. These objectives and targets will provide the basis for ongoing evaluation and review of work programmes.

The plan will be implemented at a number of levels some of which Sligo Arts Service will have direct responsibility for, such as information, advice and research strands, together with the allocation of all grant and award schemes. In other areas, however, delivery will involve working in partnership with other local authority departments, arts organisations and public agencies.

Responsibility for the implementation of the plan lies with the Arts Officer and the staff of Sligo Arts Department.

Feidhmiú an Phlean

Cuireann an pleán nua creatlach cúig bliana ar fáil do Sheirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh go háitiúil thar ceann Comhaire Chontae Shligigh, i gcomhar le Comhaire Bhuirge Shligigh, agus ar bhonn náisiúnta leis an gComhairle Ealaíon. Déantar sainaithint sa chreatlach ar na gniomhartha straitéiseacha ábhartha. Beidh mar bhonn le gach ceann de na ocht gcinn de ghniomhsnáitheanna Pleananna Olbriúcháin bliantúla a chuirfidh sios ar na cuspóirí agus ar na spríocanna oibre a bheidh le cur i gcrích. Bainfear leas as na cuspóirí agus as na spríocanna seo chun meastóireacht agus albhreithniú leanúnach ar gclár oibre.

Cuirfear an pleán i bhfeidhm ag cúpla leibhéal. Beidh Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh freagrach as roinnt do na snáitheanna, fásnéis, comhairle agus taighde ina measc chomh maith le déileadh ar dheontais agus ar dhuais-scéimeanna. I reimsi eile áfach, braithfidh feidhmiú ar chompháirtíocht le rannóga áltíula eile, le eagrais ealaíona agus le gniomhairteachta poiblí.

Is iad an tOifigeach Ealaíona agus foireann Rannóg na nEalaíon i Sligeach a bheidh freagrach as an bpleán a chur i bhfeidhm.

Areas of Action

Sligo Arts Service has identified **eight** areas of strategic action which set out the mission, actions and supports for that area. There is also an art-form reference section for ease of access.

In advancing these areas of strategic action work will be informed by the following guiding principles:

Sligo Arts Service and its work are located within the wider ambit of services provided by Sligo County Council and Sligo Borough Council and they reflect the values and principles of the Sligo Local Authorities SLA's Corporate Plan and the County Development Board's Strategy for integrated economic, social and cultural development.

The implementation of the new Arts Plan must take account of the capacity of the Sligo Arts Service and of its financial and other resources.

The Arts Plan values the distinctive contribution that artists make to society and the important contribution of local arts organisations in creating positive encounters between artists and the many publics who constitute the citizens of Sligo.

The plan recognises that individuals and organisations will act autonomously, values such independent action and will seek to support it when it aligns with the arts and wider policy goals of the SLA's.

The Arts Plan views and provides for the arts as a fundamental human endeavour. As such, Sligo Arts Service works for all citizens – of all ages, places, social backgrounds and economic circumstances – so they can participate in and enjoy the arts.

The new Arts Plan is a plan for the support and development of the arts in Sligo by Sligo County Council, acting independently and also with a range of players and partners, as joint-agents or as key-deliverers. Those partners might be within the SLA's, within the Sligo arts / culture sector, or within the wider social, community, or cultural sector, locally or nationally.

The Arts Plan will build upon the achievements and the learning emerging from the many actions undertaken by the Sligo Arts Service since 1997. It will pay particular attention to the mainstreaming of projects and developments initiated by Sligo arts service and requiring to exist independently.

Gníomhréimsí

Treoirphronsabail

Tá **ocht** gcinn de ghníomhréimsí straitéiseacha sainaitheanta ag Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh a leagann amach an misean, na beartais agus na tacaiochtai i ngach réimse diobh. Chun rochtain a éascú tugtar chomh maith rannóg tagartha de na firmeacha ealaíne faoi seach.

Is ar bhonn na dtreoirphronsabail seo a leanas a chuirfear ar aghaidh na réimsi oibre straitéise:

— Is cuid de raon leathan feidhme Chomhairle Chontae Shligigh agus Chomhaire Bhuirge Shligigh a Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh agus a cuid oibre. Léirionn si más ea luachanna agus prionsabail Phlean Chorpáraídeach Údarás Áitiúla Shligigh agus straitéis Bhord Forbraiochta an Chontae i leith forbairt chomhtháithe eacnamaioch, sóisialta agus cultúrtha.

— Caithfidh feidhmiú an Phlean Nua Ealaíona cumas Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh a chur san aíreamh ó thaobh airgeadais agus acmhainní eile de.

— Tá meas ag an bPlean Ealaíona ar chion sainiúil ealaíontóiri i leith na socháil agus ar thábhacht eagrais ealaíona áltíula toisc na teagmhála dearfacha a chothaionn siad idir ealaíontóiri agus pobal eágcsúla Shligigh.

— Aithinnionn an pleán go bhfeidhmeoidh daoine aonaracha agus eagrais go neamhspléach. Tá meas ag an bPlean ar ghníomhartha neamhspléacha agus déanfar iarracht iad a thacú nuair a thagann siad le cheile le haidhmeanna ealaíona agus polasaithe eile Údarás Áitiúla Shligigh.

— Tuigtear sa Phlean Ealaíona gur buntallann daonna iad na healaíona agus curfear ar fáil dóibh dá réir. Dá bhri sin beidh Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh ag obair ar son gach uile shaoránach — is cuma aois, altreamh, cultúr, sóisialta nó eacnamaioch — d'fhiann agus pobal eágcsúla Shligigh.

— Is pleán tacaiochta agus forbraiochta do na healaíona i Sligeach ó Chomhaire Chontae Shligigh é an Plean Ealaíona. Beidh siad ag feidhmiú go neamhspléach agus le raon compháirtíochtai. Feidhmeoidh na páirtnéirí seo mar chomh-ghníomhairí nó mar fheidhmeannaigh lárnacha. D'fheáfadadh na páirtnéirí seo a bheith mar chuid de Údarás Áitiúla Shligigh, nó mar cuid de rannóng na n-ealaíona nó cultúr i Sligeach. D'fheáfadadh leis a bheith mar chuid de rannóga sóisialta, pobal nó cultúrtha go háitiúil nó go náisiúnta.

— Déanfaidh an Plean Ealaíona forbairt ar na héachtaí agus na ceachtanna a nochtaigh na gniomhartha eagsúla a thug Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh ó 1997. Direoidh sé go speisialta ar lárstrúth a dhéanamh ar na tionscnaimh agus na forbraiochtaí neamhspléacha a chur Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh túis leo.

The new Arts Plan will place a (continued) premium on the role of Sligo Arts Service as an agent of strategic change and developmental action. To that end, the plan seeks to balance innovation and sustainability, as well as the measured application of resources to 'achieve a few things well'.

The new Arts Plan takes account of the wider cultural opportunities released by much current social and physical planning. In particular, the implementation of the National Spatial Strategy and of the new National Development Plan—in which Sligo is designated as a 'Gateway' city – informs the Arts Plan. The Arts Plan seeks to ensure that account is taken of the immense potential of the arts to make a distinctive contribution to the wider development of Sligo.

— Beidh páirt Seirbhís Ealaíona Shligigh mar ghníomhaire do athraithe straitéise agus gnímh forbartha rí-thábhachtach go fóill sa Phlean Nua Ealaíona. Chun é sin a bhaint amach, féachfaidh an pleán le nuálaocht agus inbhuaine a chothromú, chomh maith le achmhainní a fhéidhmíú go cúramach 'chun cúpla rud fiúntacha a bhaint amach':

— Airíonn an Plean Nua Ealaíona na deiseanna nua cultúrtha nochtaithe ag an bpleanáil reatha sna réimsí shóisialta agus fisiciúil. Déanann feidhmíú an Straitéis Spásúil Náisiúnta agus an Plean Forbraiochta Náisiúnta ach go háirithe – ina ainmhithe Sligeach mar chathair 'Bealach Isteach' – faisnéisíú ar an bPlean Ealaíona. Tá an Plean Ealaíona chun rí-lárracht a dhéanamh sárach-mhainneacht na healaíona dul i gcion ar fhorbairt Shligigh a chothú.

Strand 1 Developing Arts, Culture and the Public Realm

An exciting and increasingly important aspect of contemporary arts practice in Ireland is the presence of art in the public realm. This tradition is complimentary to provision for the arts in dedicated buildings e.g. theatres, galleries and concert halls.

Public Art has a particular significance in the integration of art in the public realm. The term public art is used to describe work created and produced by artists within the natural or built environment. Sligo's public art strategy aims to secure the highest levels of creativity and innovation in commissioning artists and to ensure integration by placing it within the planning and development process. It also focuses on the need to involve communities in schemes that re-animate or re-define their physical, social or cultural spaces.

In the Wider Cultural Agenda the designation of Sligo as a 'Gateway' City in the National Spatial Strategy ensures that Sligo will undergo unprecedented levels of new building, environmental improvement and infrastructural development. This level of development and regeneration offers enormous potential for collaboration between planners, developers, architects, urban designers and artists. It also creates opportunities to animate the public realm and enrich street life through book markets, outdoor exhibitions, festivals, carnivals, outdoor screenings, public art and performances. In this way the public can experience and enjoy the arts in streets, squares, parks, and other locations. These arts practices play a central role in uplifting and empowering local people; transforming how they feel, behave or interact with each other; celebrating identity, reinforcing sense of place; and developing active citizenship. In short improving 'quality of life'.

The arts plan will seek to influence 'Gateway' developments in order to secure the distinctive contribution of the arts in the design and planning of the public realm.

PUBLIC ART PROGRAMME Policy & Strategy

The policy of the Sligo Local Authorities is published in their public art plan *Art Best Placed*, 2004. The principles articulated in this plan will remain but the strategy will be updated on an ongoing basis in order to respond to new opportunities arising from Gateway and County development projects.

The public art policy of the Sligo Local Authorities will largely be delivered through the mechanism of the Per Cent for Art Scheme allocated by the Department of Heritage, the Environment & Local Government.

Snáithe 1 Forbairt

An Ealaíon Poiblí, tá tábhacht ar leith léi maidir le comhtháthú na n-ealaíona sa réimse poiblí. Úsáidtear an téarma Ealaíon Poiblí chun cur síos a dhéanamh ar obair a chruthaíonn ealaíontóiri mar chuid den tímpeallach nádúrtha nó tógha. Is é straitéis Ealaíon Poiblí Shligigh ná cruthaitheacht agus nuálacht den scóth a chothú in obair na n-ealaíontóiri ar a déantar coimisiúnú. Déantar comhtháthú ar an obair tráin ionnú sa phróiseas pleanála agus forbraíochta. Maidir le scéimeanna a dhéanann athbheochan agus athmhiniú ar na spásanna fisiciúla, sóisialta agus cultúrtha, deimhneoidh an straitéis seo go mbeidh na pobail ábhartha bainteach go dlúth leo.

Sa LeathanChláir Oibre Cultúrtha, cinníteoidh ainmníuchán Shligigh mar chathair 'Bealach Isteach' sa Straitéis Spásúil Náisiúnta go mbeidh ann leibhéal gan macasamhail den nuathóigáil chomh maith le feabhsú comhshaoil agus forbraíocht bhonneagair. Tá sa leibhéal nua seo forbraíochta agus athnuachana mórdeiseanna chomhoibrithe idir pleanálaithe, forbróiri, ailtíri, dearthóiri uirbeacha agus ealaíontóiri. Ina theannta sin, soláthraitear deiseanna chun an réimse poiblí a athbheochan agus saol sráide na cathrach a shaibhriú le margai leabhar, taispeántais faoin aer, féilte, feiseanna, scannáin faoin aer, ealaíon poiblí agus beoléiríte. Sa tsúl seo, gheobhaidh an pobal taithí ar na h-ealaíona, agus taitneamh astu, ar na sráideanna, sna cearnóga, sna páirceanna agus in iliomad suíomh eile. Tá ról lárnach ag na cleachtais seo ealaíona chun an pobal áitiúil a chumasú agus ardú meanamh a thabhairt doilbh. Athraitear meon, idir mothúcháin, iompar agus idirghniomháocht le chéile. Déantar féiniúlacht a cheiliúradh. Treisítear ar an tuiscint don áit dhúchais agus déantar an tsaoráinacht ghníomhach a chothú. Go hachomair, cuirtear feabhas nach beag ar 'cháilíocht na beathe'.

Trid an bPlean Ealaíona, déanfar dícheall dul i bhfeidhm ar na forbraiochtai de ioradh an ainmníuchán 'Bealach Isteach' ionas go mbeidh tionchar sainiúil ag na healaíona ar dhearradh agus ar phleánal an réimse poiblí.

An Clár Ealaíona Poiblí *Polasaí agus Straitéis*

— Foilsíodh polasai Údarás Áitiúla Shligigh ina bplean don ealaíon poiblí, Barr-Ionad don Ealaíon (*Art Best Placed*), 2004. Fanfaidh na prionsabail ar ar cuireadh síos orthu sa phlean seo mar atá, ach déanfar uasdátú orthu go rialta chun déileáil le pé deiseanna nua a thiocfaidh as tionscnaimh fhorbraiochta an Chontae nó 'Bealach Isteach'.



Strand 2 Developing Partnerships and Joint Actions

Deriving from its governing commitment to high quality public service arts provision, and in keeping with its commitment to working in partnership, Sligo Arts Service will secure and grow a small number of key strategic collaborations with arts organisations, and also with agencies and bodies operating in the wider social, community and local government domain with a view to supporting mutually beneficial programmes of *In Context* arts work.

There are two types of partnerships:

Arts Development Partnerships

Public Service Partnerships 3 categories of Health, Education and Local Government

Arts Development Partnerships

Sligo Arts Service proposes to develop strategic partnerships with a small number of identified professional arts organisations with whom it has established working relationships. These are regarded by Sligo Arts Service as important artistic resources with whom it will seek to engage in tackling a broad range of arts development issues. To this end incentive funds will be awarded to support curated projects and planned programmes in specific areas of work, or with specific sections of the public identified as priorities by Sligo Arts Service. These new partnerships will be the subject of ongoing monitoring and evaluation and will adopt a long-term strategic approach.

Sligo Arts Service will partner with; Blue Raincoat Theatre Company, to undertake a programme of development initiatives in theatre and dance with specific groups in Tubbercurry; Sligo Art Gallery, to develop 'Primary Colours' a programme to enrich the primary school visual art curriculum through the involvement of practicing artists and an annual exhibition curated for children; Model Arts::Niland Gallery, to secure niche festivals and high quality programmes with specific reference to music and literature; Hawk's Well Theatre, to explore new strategies for audience development; Ceolaras Coleman, to address development needs in the traditional arts with particular attention to the innovative use of seven purpose built studios/workshops at Mount Irwin.

The framework for the development of the partnerships and the programme is as follows: Sligo Arts Service and the named organisations will identify areas of common concern. This will lead to the development of a joint plan to address identified goals, which will result in a series of agreed actions with targeted audiences in specific geographic locations.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT PARTNERSHIPS**Cross Border Omagh Sligo Cultural Partnership**

Sligo County Council and Omagh District Council have committed to establishing and funding a cultural programme to extend and deepen the long-standing partnership between the two local authorities. The focus of this joint cultural programme is the celebration of diversity and the fostering of intercultural understanding through the development of a range of arts programmes and projects involving exchanges, collaborations and other joint initiatives.

Arts & Disability Seminar, Strule Arts Centre, involving Touch the Sky Performance Group – Model::Niland and Rehab Care partnership.

Good Relations Seminar.

Arts Council Local Partnership Scheme Music Research Partnership

In the context of the Arts Council's Local Partnership Scheme, Sligo Arts Service formed a partnership with Wexford County Council and St. Patrick's College, Drumcondra (2006). The partnership initiated a research project to examine the contribution by Local Authorities to music development in Ireland. The research findings will be published and it is envisaged that they will be presented at a national seminar to be organised by the partners.

Arts Council Local Partnership Scheme AXIS W Proposal

This partnership involves 8 County Councils (Clare, Galway, North Tipperary, Mayo, Donegal, Leitrim, Roscommon and Sligo) and the Clare arts organisation 'Shifting Ground' who have come together to stimulate critical debate about the relationship between contemporary art practice and non-metropolitan culture through the development of two 'high quality' publications over the course of a year. The process will involve commissioned articles, research and newly commissioned artworks.

Sligo Local Authorities County Library Service

Sligo Arts Service will partner with the County Library Service and other existing literary programmers (e.g. Yeats Society, *Scriobh*, Model Arts::Niland Gallery) to establish a more co-ordinated programme of activities designed to promote literature in a variety of contexts.

Strand 3 Supporting The Artist

Professional artists of all disciplines who live and work in Sligo are valued members of the community, with a distinctive contribution to make to the quality of life in the city and county. Sligo Arts Service recognises that, in partnership with others – chiefly the Arts Council, it has a responsibility to provide financial and other assistance to artists, so that they can be supported in the making and presentation of their work and in their professional development. Furthermore Sligo Arts Service is committed to facilitating high quality engagement between artists and the public, most especially through projects and programmes where artists work in community contexts and in health, education and other social settings.

Supporting artists of all disciplines in their need for Time, Space and Facilities to develop their work;

This new annual award will honour the late Sligo based artist and lecturer, John O'Leary and support a fine art graduate of the Institute of Technology Sligo (IT Sligo) with studio time, materials, exhibition space and print for their first exhibition. The award will be delivered in partnership with the Fine Art Department, IT Sligo and Sligo Art Gallery.

Supporting artists of all disciplines to develop their own practice by availing of once-off or short term training and professional development opportunities, such as masterclasses, workshops and short courses within the island of Ireland.

Other Financial Supports [Arts Act Grants](#)

Grants advertised annually to nurture and support a broad range of arts projects.

An annual Funding Publication will provide details of funding categories and criteria for grant aid (see Strand 8).

Film and World Cinema

Sligo Arts Service, in partnership with Leitrim County Council/Leitrim Cinemobile, Sligo Film Society and *Twisted Reels*, propose to develop an exhibition/screening programme and related projects to grow audiences for world cinema in the city and county.

Sligo Arts Service will work in partnership with the local film sector to develop a strong database of resources and opportunities for film making in the North West (see Strand 8).

Information, Advice and Research (IAR) Service

Sligo Arts Service's revised IAR Service will work closely with the professional arts sector to create a high quality information and promotion service to mutual benefit, and especially to address the information needs of the general public.

Strand 5 Supporting Amateur, Voluntary and Community Sector

One of the heartbeats of the arts in Sligo is the range and quality of work undertaken by amateur, voluntary groups and individuals across all art forms and genres. Encouraging and supporting such work, and fostering especially the transmission of tradition and the development of skills are key goals of the Sligo Arts Service.

The parallel tradition of arts practice by with and in communities will continue to be supported vigorously by Sligo Arts Service in a range of ways. In this context 'community' may be defined by shared interest, age, location or ethnicity.

Direct Financial Supports**Annual Revenue Grants for Feiseanna, Festivals and Summer Schools****Annual Arts Act Grant Scheme**

An annual Grants and Awards Publication will provide details of funding categories and criteria for grant aid (see Strand 8).

Other Grants and Awards Amateur and Voluntary Arts Awards

Sligo Arts Service will introduce a new award scheme targeting amateur/voluntary arts groups. It is envisaged that two awards will be offered annually. Applications will be sought from;

- a) choirs, bands or music groups/societies
- b) art groups /photography clubs
- c) creative writing groups
- d) amateur drama societies/companies

The awards are intended to support projects or programmes of work designed to develop the expertise and skills of the group's members through engagement with professional practitioners. Proposals which involve collaboration between one or more groups will be particularly welcome.

An annual Grants and Awards Publication will provide details of funding categories and criteria for grant aid (see Strand 8).

Other Grants and Awards 'New Communities' Arts Fund

Recognising the value and the desirability of sharing and exchanging arts practices and traditions from different cultures, Sligo Arts Service will establish a modest fund directed at supporting the provision of arts work by non Irish individuals or groups based in Sligo city and county.

Sligo Arts Service will assist Ceoláras Coleman in its plan to develop artisan studio workshop spaces at Mount Irwin, County Sligo.

Aim to develop site content to link with other Arts Officers e.g. 30% information specific to Sligo, 70% general to local authority Arts Offices nationally. Explore opportunities for shared design and comprehensive information and links to other local authority Arts Offices.

Monthly Arts e-Bulletin

Increase the reach of the arts e-bulletin to a wider audience e.g. in the education, social, economic and commercial sectors, and make it more flexible so it targets specific constituencies.

Sligo Events Quarterly

This publication will be reviewed to take account of new information tools which have been developed by Sligo Arts Service and others.

Annual Grants and Awards Brochure

Produce an annual brochure listing awards, bursaries and other funding opportunities, and providing details on criteria, terms and conditions.

Databases and Networking

Sligo Arts Service with other relevant partners, both local and national, will seek to build a continuously updated system of databases, networks and other information to support the work of artists, practitioners and the public in a coherent and user friendly fashion.

Sligo Arts Service in partnership with a third level institution will jointly commission a research study based on interviews with people who have been involved in participation based arts projects and programmes in County Sligo.

The purpose of the research is to determine people's attitudes on aspects of the arts and in particular whether their participation has altered their views and in what way.

The implications for future provision by Sligo Arts Service and Sligo based arts organisations in the domains of 'outreach' and 'audience development' will be a further focus for the research.
