Celebrating Vogler Quartet in Sligo 1999 – 2004

Introduction

Vogler Quartet in Sligo was once referred to as "the extraordinary phenomenon that is the residency of the Vogler Quartet in Sligo" by the Irish Times, Music Critic, Michael Dervan. Indeed what has happened here in music development since 1999 has been extraordinary, in the best sense of the term. The lives of so many people in Sligo both young and old have been touched and inspired by the music-making of the Vogler Quartet.

From 12 year-old Jordan Higgins in Leaffoney N.S. who liked the sound of the cello because it had a deep sound, to the intimacy of St. Columba's Church in Drumcliffe for the Spring Festival where as Douglas Sealy remarked "One might be in a composer's brainpan with the music coming from every corner of the cranial walls." To the elderly man from North Sligo who travelled to hear the Voglers every time they performed.

The initiation of the residency programme in the three areas of music education, instrumental tuition and performance was an ambitious undertaking to say the least, but its success is undeniable. The legacy of the Vogler residency programme will continue through the numerous schools, teachers, voluntary committees and organisations the Quartet worked with, not least the hundreds of children who had the joy of sharing music-making with them.

In music education a new model has evolved which adds value to the curriculum because of the many teachers who gave their time so generously so that the children in their care might benefit from this unique opportunity.

In performance Sligo now has a thriving music sereis due to the tireless efforts of the voluntary music committee Con Brio and coupled with their success is the Vogler Spring Festival an excellent chamber music festival which will continue to delight and satisfy audiences for years to come.

In instrumental tuition Sligo Acadmey of Muisc under the direction Niamh Crowley and working with the Vogler Quartet sewed the seeds of a new tradition in ensemble playing through the beginners strings programme. There are now ten mini guartets who play regularly together.

Music Development in Sligo has received a significant five-year investment through the Vogler Quartet residency. We now have a successful model of sustainable partnerships at local and national level. The residency concept and programme was innovative and challenging for the partners and the many participating groups and organisations. To work as intended, it required the setting up of new structures and relationships. Ongoing consultation, research and evaluation have and will secure the learning, consolidate the partnerships and enhance the positive developments for classical music into the future.

Great tribute is due to Tim, Frank, Stephan and Stefan for their wholehearted participation in each of the three programme areas and the charm and ease with which they delivered them.

In1998 to dream that a small county in the west of Ireland would succeed in engaging the services of a world class string guartet for the delivery of a major music development initiative was both brave and bold.

Our thanks to those who had the vision, tenacitiy and courage to invest in a project of this magnitude: the members and staff of Sligo County Council and Sligo Borough Council, Music Network, the national music development agency and the Arts Council and also to those who assisted with support ESB+Music, the IRMA Trust and the Department of Education and Science (ICDU).

Sometimes it pays to dream big.

The Vogler Quartet in Sligo Music Education Programme in Primary Schools has been developing models of arts curriculum support of national relevance by focusing on the dual needs of a quality artistic experience for young people and curriculum support in the key areas of listening, composing and performing. Also inherent has been the aim to enhance the long-term professional development of teachers in County Sligo which has been achieved through high levels of teacher involvement in both design and delivery of the programme. In the 2003/2004 school year alone, the programme involves 16 schools, 20 teachers and 450 children. In excess of 1500 children have received workshops by the Vogler Quartet since 1999.
